
Easter Call to Worship




Easter Intercessions

Men: We think of the friends, who walked their lonely road to Emmaus, a journey of sadness after all the events of Holy Week. Yet you walked beside them and shared with them opening their eyes to your presence in the breaking of the bread at supper. Journey alongside all those who are sad and mourning over losses. Embrace them with your love and presence. Be close to them.

All: Open our eyes, Jesus. We long to see you and be near you when we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
